


- 1. Please cut apart the onset (letter) cards.
- 2. Please cut apart the rime (word ending) cards with pictures. These will create the "word family" or rhyming words.
- 3. Draw a rime (word family ending) card.
- 4. Write as many different words as you can by adding an onset (a letter/sound to the beginning.
- 5. For example, if you pick the ending ___at, you could add a "b" and make "bat", a "c" and make "cat", an "f" and make "fat", or an "h" and make "hat".
- 6. Write as many words as you can with each rime (word ending).
- 7. Then draw another rime (word ending) card, and begin again.
- 8. Practice will make you better and better at this.



Syllable Count

- 1. Please cut the picture cards apart
- 2. Say the name of each picture
- 3. Ask yourself, do you hear one, two, three, or four parts. For example, when you say "cat", you hear only one part. When you say, "daddy", you hear two parts. When you say "elephant", you hear three parts. You are counting the parts you hear when you say the word. These parts are called syllables.
- 4. Place each picture in the correct column which identifies the number of parts or syllables that you hear. 1, 2, 3, or 4.

1 Syllable	2 Syllables	3 Syllables	4 Syllables






Digraphs
