

# **Sensational Similes**

(Sensational: Exceedingly Great)

3<sup>rd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> Grades

- What is a Simile: A simile is the comparison of two unlike things using the word LIKE and the word AS. For example: He is as busy as a beaver. We are not saying he is a beaver. We are saying her is working like a beaver.
- Describe Objects in the Room: Ask students to find several objects in the room they can describe: chair, table, something shiny, something heavy, something light, something narrow, something wide, something strong, something weak, etc. Students work in partner-pairs. Choose one or two of the objects. Students write at least three similes about each object: This chair is as strong as Superman. This chair is as strong as a buffalo. This chair is as strong as a sumo wrestler. Encourage them to describe the other object using the word LIKE. For example: This table is like a rock. This table is like doll house furniture. This table is like wobbly plastic

<ul> <li>Listen for the Similes: The teacher will read similes. Students guess who or what it is:</li> </ul>
<ol> <li>I'm as hungry as a (horse)</li> <li>He ran as fast as a (cheetah)</li> <li>It was shining as bright as a (star)</li> <li>Her smile was like (The sun shining)</li> <li>Her hair was a blond as (A field of wheat)</li> <li>He was as busy as a (bee)</li> <li>He is as cool as a (cucumber)</li> <li>It was as dry as a (bone)</li> <li>He was as blind as a (bat)</li> <li>Grandpa was a wise as a (owl)</li> </ol>
• Draw the Smiles: Ask students to draw these similes or the similes above (1) He was as busy as a beaver. (2) She was as cute as a button. (3) He was as silly as a goose. (4) Her hair is as smooth as silk. (5) The line was as straight as an arrow. (6) The kitten was as blind as a bat. (7) His fried egwas as flat as a pancake. (7) The cat's teeth were as sharp as needles.
• Change the Similes to Metaphors: Change the similes above to metaphors by taking out the words AS or LIKE and substituting a "to be" verb (is, are, be, is, and was). For example: The simile is, "He was as busy as a beaver." The metaphor is, "He is a busy beaver." Simile: "I'm as hungry as a horse." Metaphor: "I am very hungry." This is best done as a whole group lesson.

• What Does it Mean? Ask students to define each simile in kid's language.  Choose similes from above. For example: "He ran as fast as a cheetah." He

can really run fast! "It was shining as bright as a star." It was shining

brightly. "Her smile was like the sun shining." She had a beautiful smile.

- Simile Practice: The teacher reads these sentences. Students respond with, "Yes, good Job," if it is a simile; or "Oops, Try Again," if it is not a simile.
  - 1. My dog is as wise as an owl. (Yes, good Job)
  - 2. The snake sings. (Oops, Try Again)
  - 3. Gold is pretty, gold is money. (Oops)
  - 4. A computer is like the desk it sits on. (Yes)
  - 5. Moon screams at the sun. (Oops)
  - 6. Gold, gold, gold, Where's the gold? (Oops)
  - 7. My jacket is like a piece of cloth with a heater. (Yes)
  - 8. Light swims through my window. (Oops)
  - 9. My shirt is like a bird. (Yes)
  - 10. The stars are bright tonight. (Oops)
  - 11. My dog's eyes are as kind as a rainbow. (Yes)
- Simple Poem: "Playing the piano is <u>like</u> a bird soaring in the sky.
