

Simple, Compound, Complex, Compound-Complex Sentences

Directions

- 1. You can play this game by yourself. It is more fun with several other players.
- 2. Player one draws a card that states simple, compound, complex, and compound/complex.
- 3. Player makes up a sentence that is indicated on the card drawn.
- 4. Player says sentence to everyone, tells which space he/she will cover.
- 5. If opponents do not agree, they may challenge the sentence.
- 6. Player with most squares covered, wins.

Simple Sentence: a sentence consisting of only one clause, with a single subject and predicate.

John rode his bike.

Compound Sentence: a sentence with more than one subject and predicate-each piece is a sentence. **John rode his bike and Jorge walked along.**

Complex Sentence: a sentence containing a subordinate clause or clauses-one piece is not a sentence. While Jill was riding her scooter, John rode his bike.

Compound/Complex Sentence: a sentence having two or more coordinate independent clauses and one or more dependent clauses

While Jill was riding her scooter, John rode his bike and Jorge walked along.
